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## **BACHELOR OF SOCIAL WORK**

### Academic Requirements

The Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) is a four-year degree with admission at third year. To be eligible for admission to the BSW program, applicants must have a minimum of 54 credits of transferable coursework (60 recommended) with a minimum GPA of 2.33. This is a Selective Admission program; meeting the minimum requirement does not guarantee acceptance. The credit requirements for admission can be met in the following two ways:

- 1. General university studies (see list of acceptable electives on Page 2 of this form): Min. 60 credits required for admission (Students with 54 credits may be considered)
- 2. *Or* completion of a Human Service Diploma and/or Education Assistant and Community Support Certificate Program with a minimum of 54 credits.
