## Anti-Racism Training Workshop

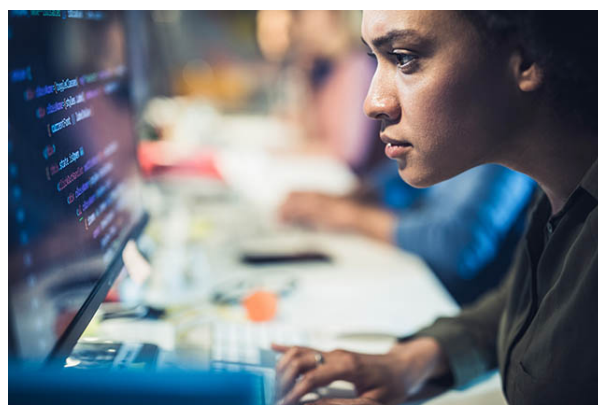


The Faculty of Science and Nursing have collaborated in a series of workshops entitled "Righting History". An Anti-

### TRU AA Grads - CCAA Certified Exam Results



Congratulations are in order to all the TRU Anesthesia Assistant Diploma graduates for successfully completing the national Canadian Society of Respiratory Therapists (CSRT) Anesthesia Assistant (AA) Examination in October 2021.

Twenty-nine TRU graduates passed the exam, a major requirement for attaining Certified Clinical Anesthesia Assistant certification through the CSRT. TRU graduates made up almost 50% of the total AA exam writers. These TRU graduates are working as integral members of Anesthesia Care Teams across Canada.

Anesthesia Assistants are valued allied health care providers who act as physician assistants, supporting and facilitating the work of physician anesthesiologists in delivering world-class care to patients before, during, and after their surgeries.

Physician anesthesiologists and anesthesia assistants work together as a team to ensure both the comfort and the

safety of every patient requiring anesthesia care.
