DIRECTOR’S REPORT	<p>Report by Dillon Alexandre, AVP of Campus Infrastructure, Sustainability and Ancillary Services Low Carbon District Energy System. Will be combining buildings on campus with underground piping for heating.</p>
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Phase 1 includes OM, Science, OLARA – 8 or 9 buildings will eliminate 90% of TRU’s greenhouse gases.

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The new building will go beside the generator building by Convocation Wall by OM. The building will be front and centre making sustainability front and centre.

Timelines: Start construction of building in Spring, 2022.
 Construction to be completed by September, 2022.

Existing buildings will be retrofitted.

Substantially cheaper to do the Low Carbon District Energy System than to electrify all buildings.

Natalie Yao, Energy Specialist has applied to Hydro for a 1 Mega Watt of Power.

TRU has partnered with the City of Kamloops to promote their Community Climate Action Plan – 8 big moves. Panels hanging in OM with information.

Competition for students to design solar picnic tables. 1st table will be installed at the trades building – electrical, carpentry and welding will be involved.

New bike cages to go in the Nursing Building, expanding in BCCOL and outdoor bike shelter across from the day care.

Tree Program will start up again in the Spring, 2022.
