




Summer 03 - Winter 04 Full-time Gender Distribution




Total Summer 03 - Winter 04 Gender Distribution




Academic Year Level Distribution 03-04




Summer 03 - Winter 03 Part-time Gender Distribution






Summer 03 - Winter 04 Full-time / Gender Distribution




Total Summer 03 - Winter 04 / Gender Distribution




Career/Technical Year Level Distribution 2003-2004








Summer 03 - Winter 04 Full-time / Gender Distribution






Summer 03 - Winter 04 Part-time / Gender Distribution






Total Summer 03 - Winter 04 Semesterized Vocational Gender Distribution




Total Summer 03 - Winter 04 Semesterized Vocational Age Distribution




Average Age as of Jan 01/2004 For Semesterized Vocational Students




Total Summer 03 - Winter 04 Non-Semesterized Vocational Gender






Total Summer 03 - Winter 04 Gender Distribution






Total Age Distribution Summer 03 - Winter 04







Distribution of First Nations Students by Gender and by Program






Gender Distribution by Degree: 2003-2004













UCC VOCATIONAL TRADE ENTRY GRADE DISTRIBUTIONS






Credentials Awarded at UCC Kamloops & Williams Lake: June 2004

Credentials Awarded at UCC: 1995 to 2004






