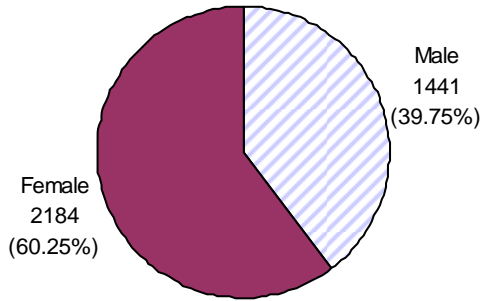

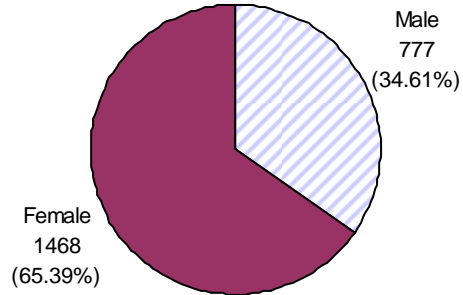

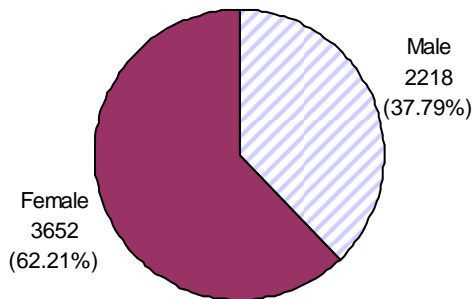
**Summer 04 - Winter 05 Full-time Gender Distribution**



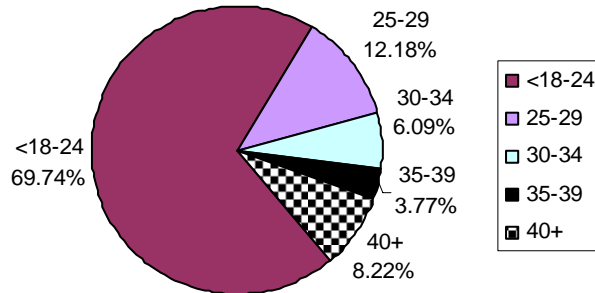
**Summer 04 - Winter 05 Part-time Gender Distribution**



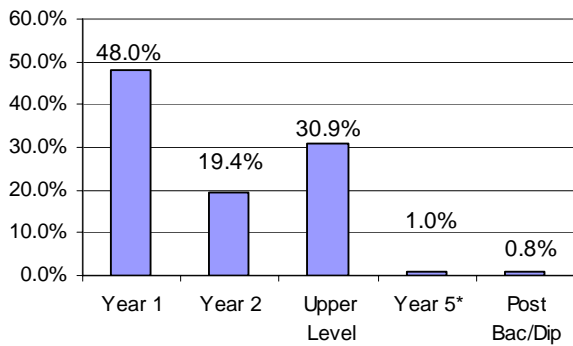
**Total Summer 04 - Winter 05 Gender Distribution**



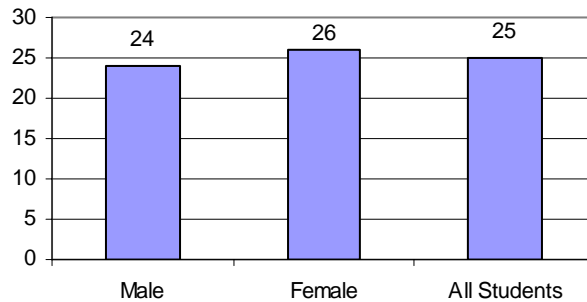
**Total Age Distribution Summer 04-Winter 05**

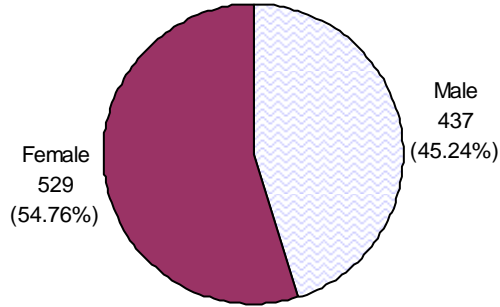

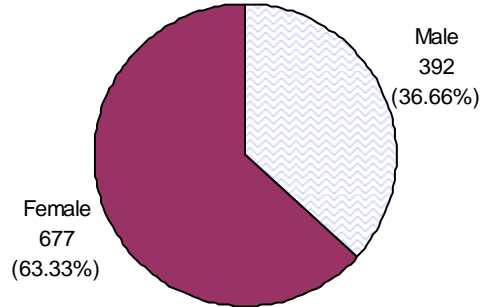

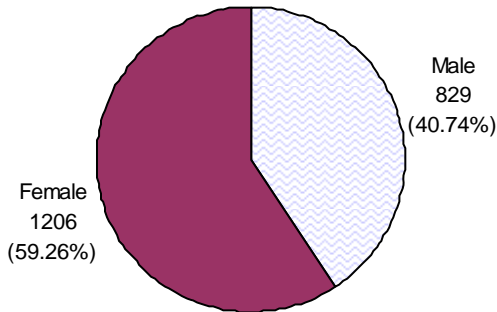
**Summer 04 - Winter 05 Full-time / Gender Distribution**



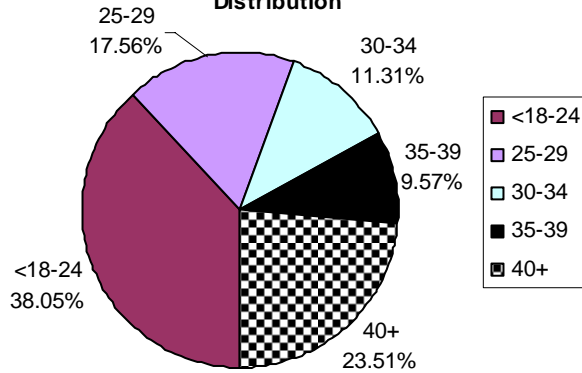
**Summer 04 - Winter 05 Part-time / Gender Distribution**



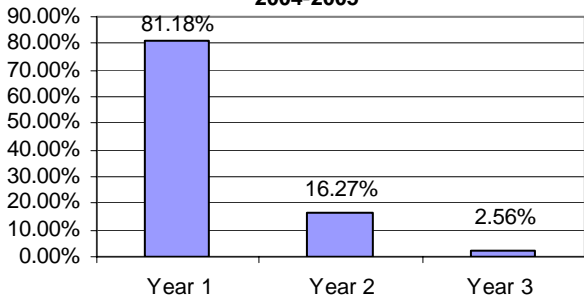
**Total Summer 04 - Winter 05 / Gender Distribution**



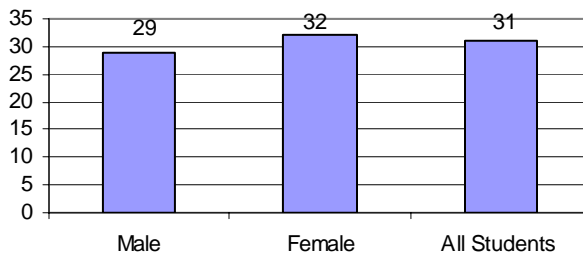
**Total Summer 04 - Winter 05 / Age Distribution**

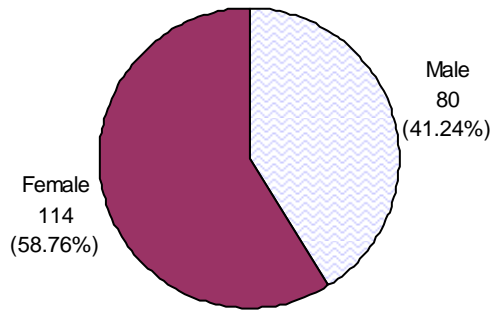

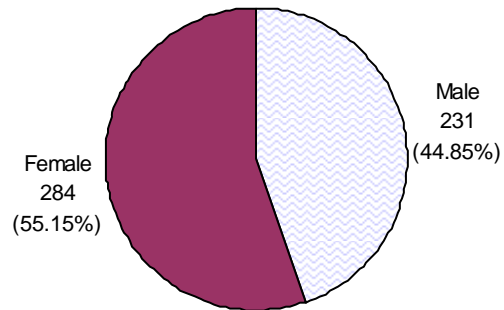

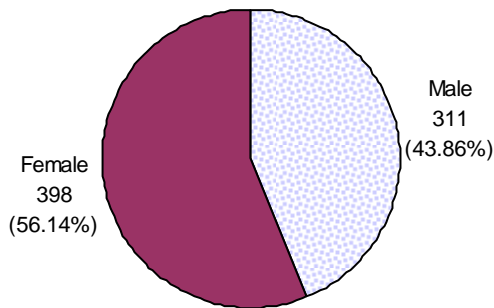
**Summer 04 - Winter 05 Full-time / Gender Distribution**



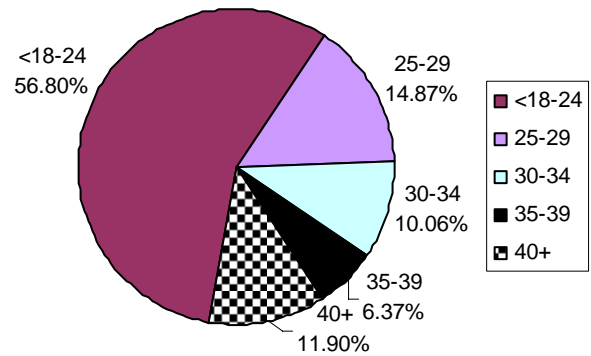
**Summer 04 - Winter 05 Part-time / Gender Distribution**



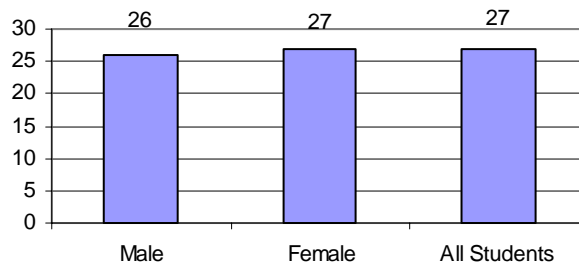
**Total Summer 04 - Winter 05 Gender Distribution**

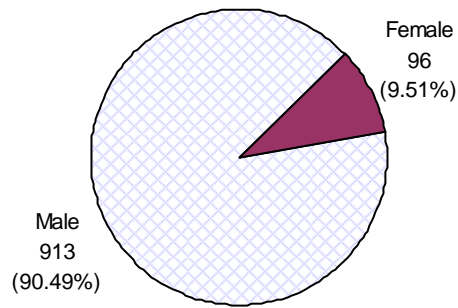

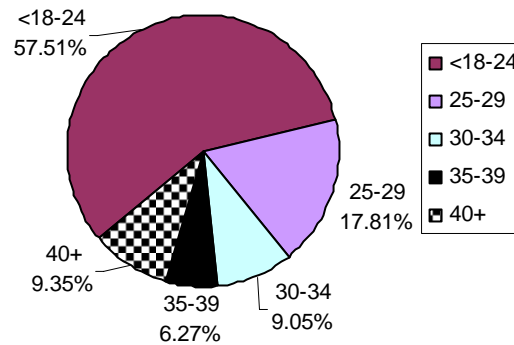

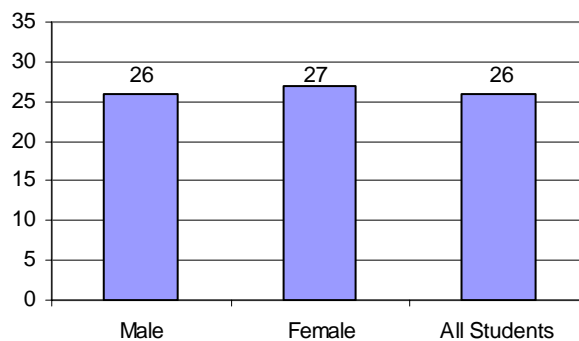
**Total Summer 04 - Winter 05 Trades

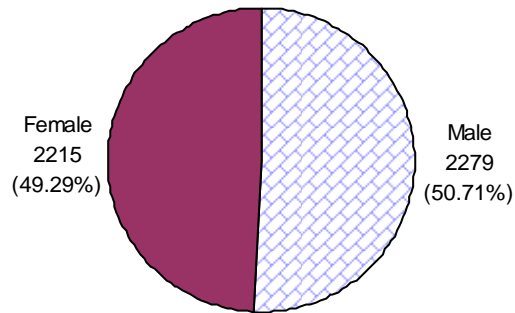

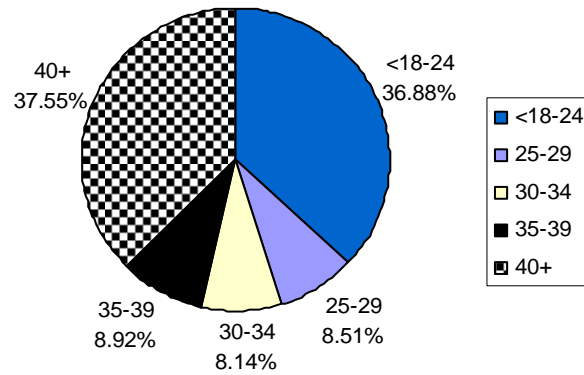

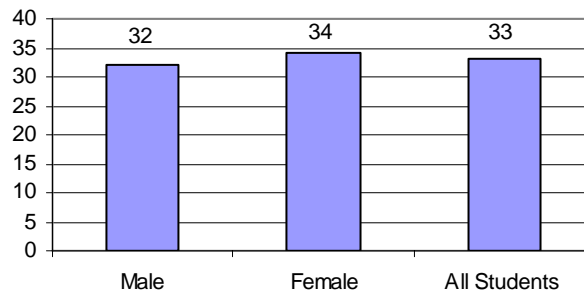
**Total Summer 04 - Winter 05 Gender Distribution**

**Average Age as of Jan 01/2005 for Continuing Studies Students**

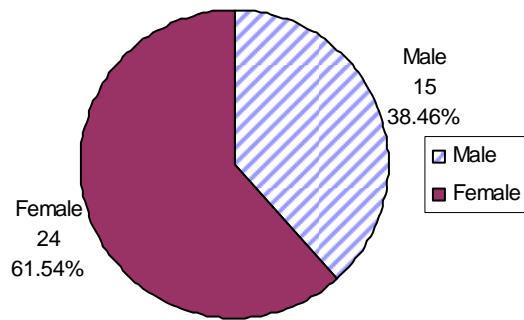

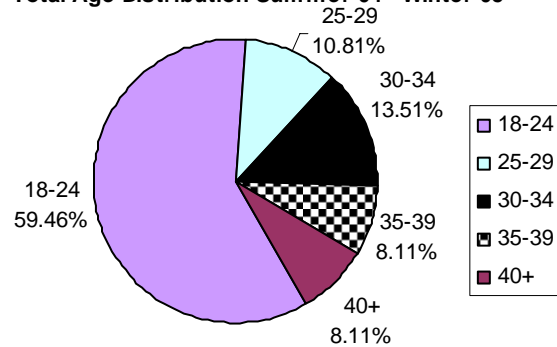

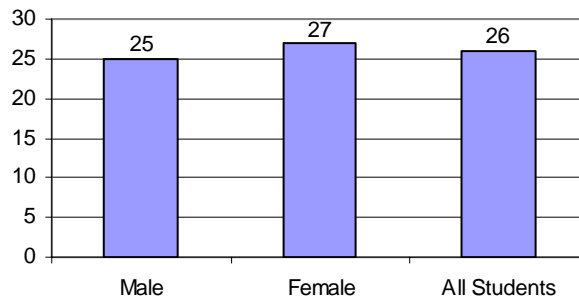
**Summer 04 - Winter 05 Gender Distribution**



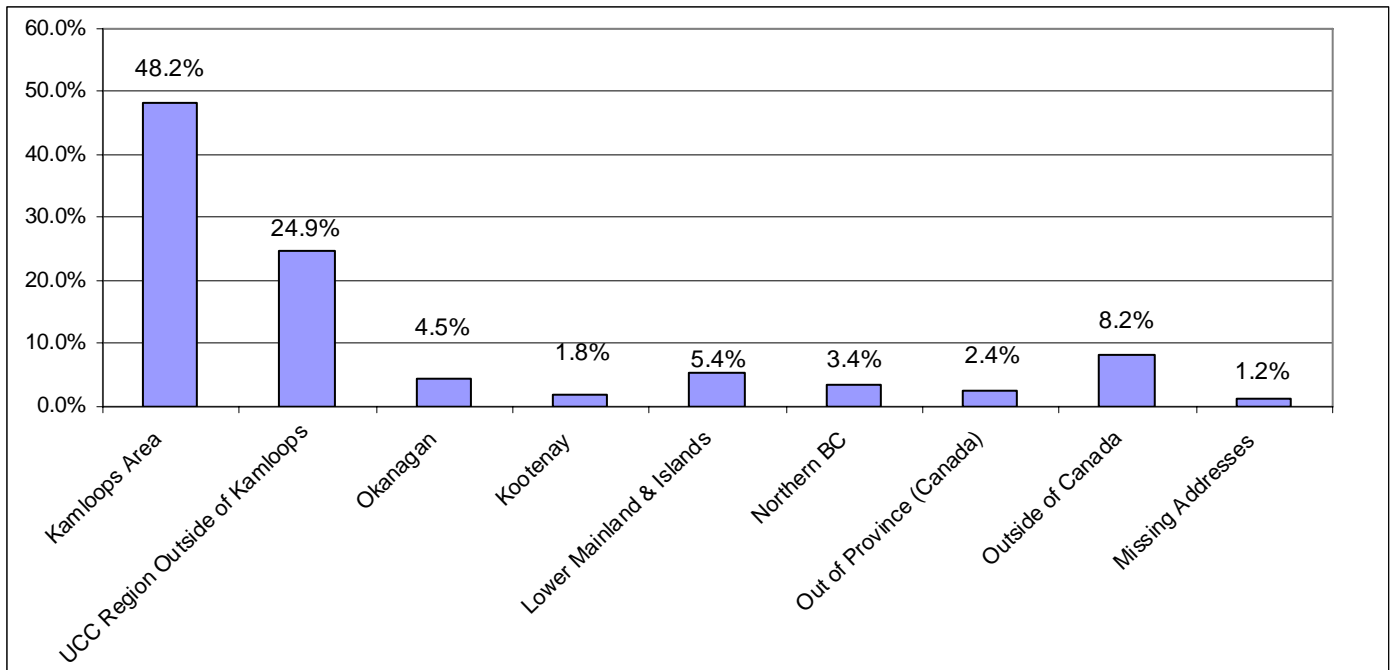
**Total Age Distribution Summer 04 - Winter 05**

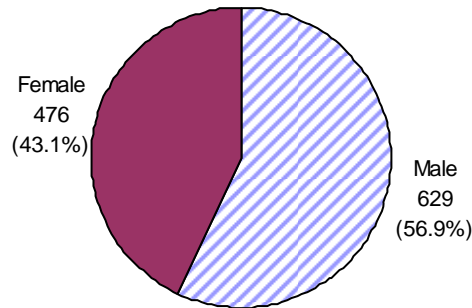

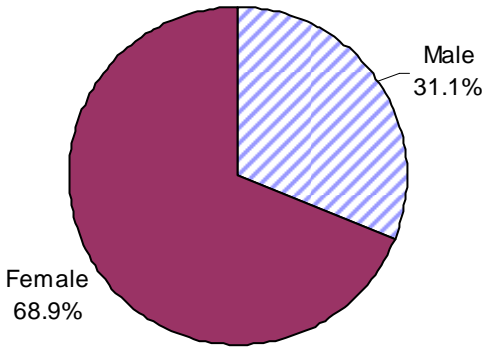

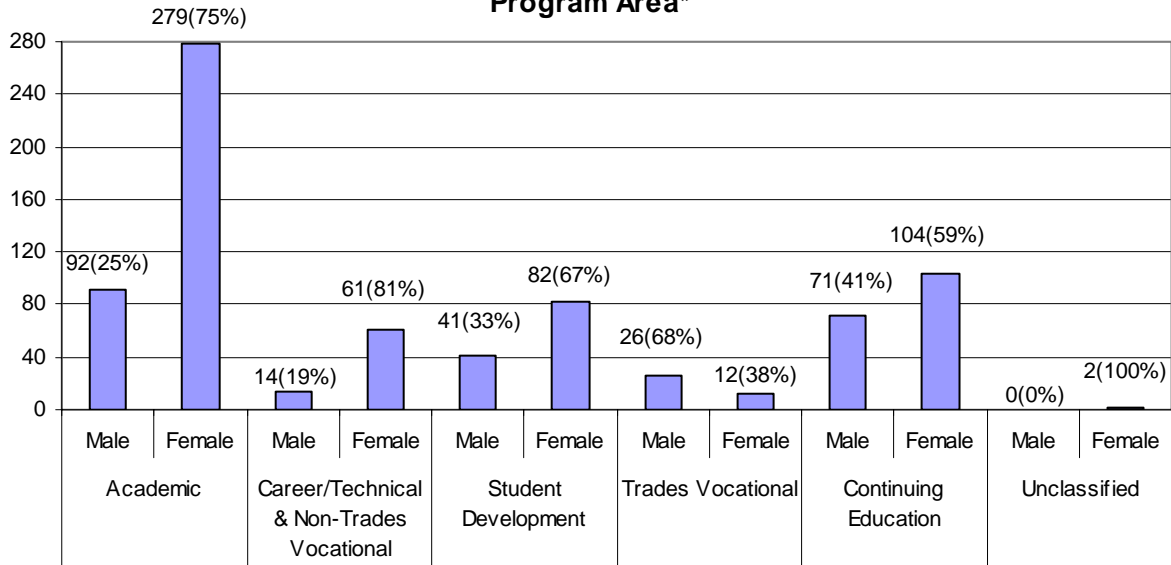

**Distribution of First Nations Students by Gender and by Program Area\***



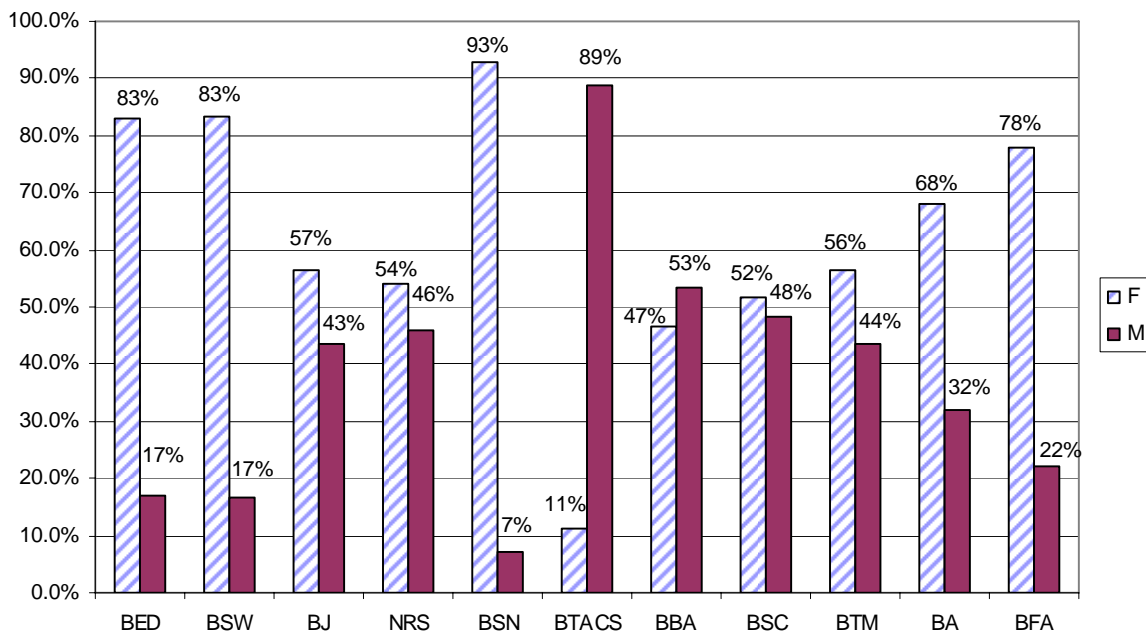

**Gender Distribution by Degree: 2004-2005**

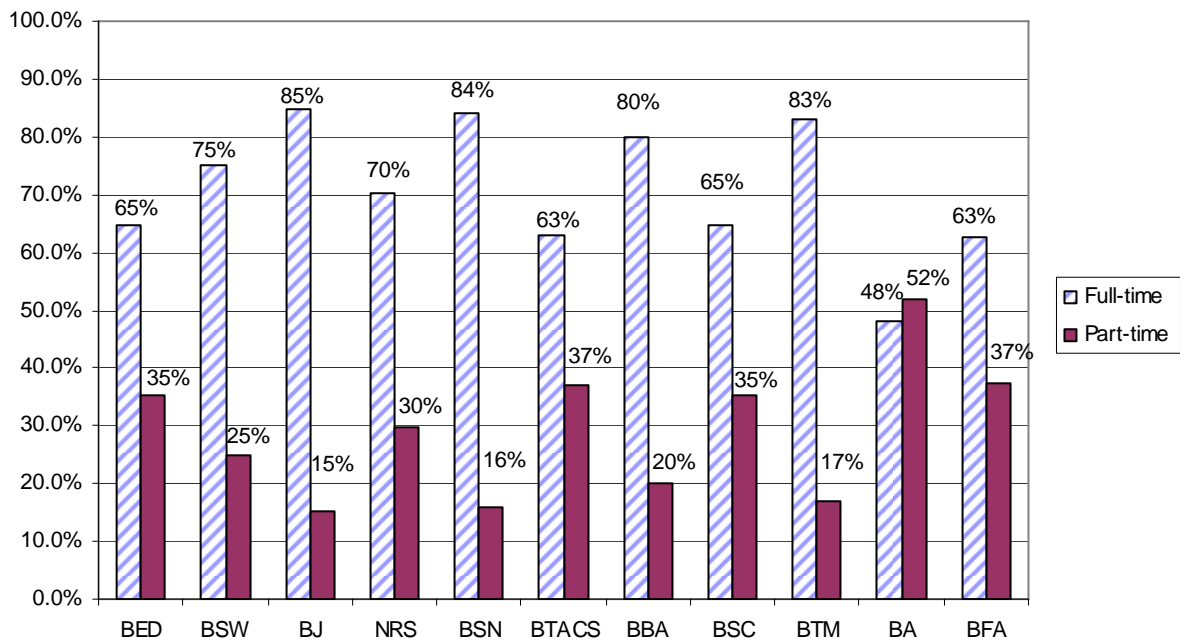

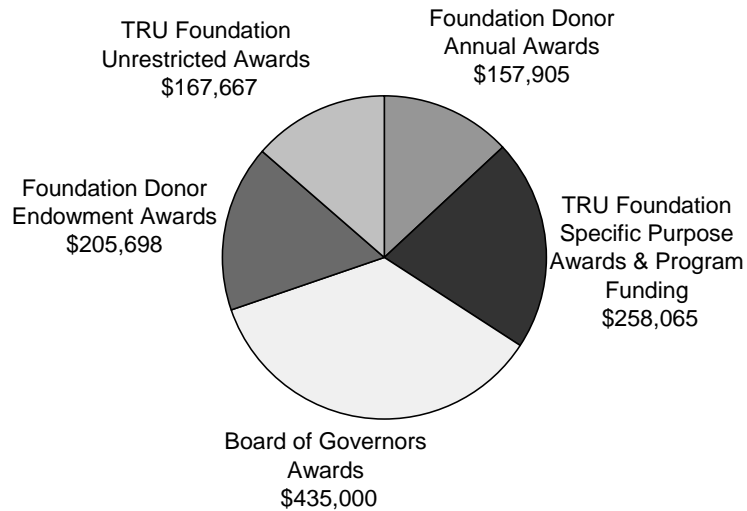

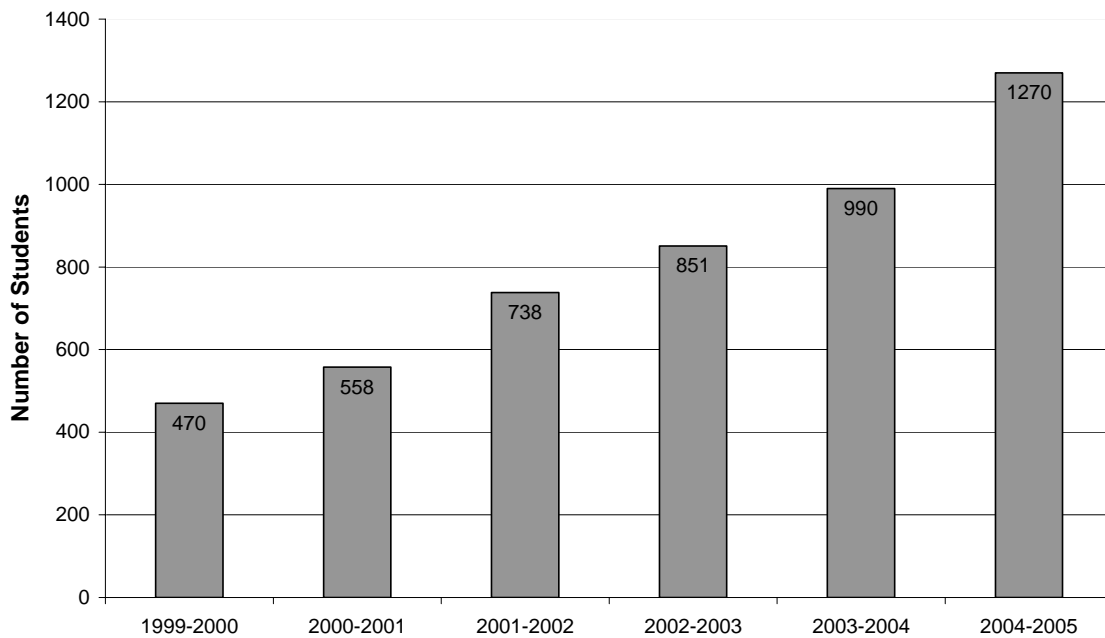
