HOW TO APPLY

1» Choose

Choose your program and start date.

2» Apply

Apply online at truworld.ca/apply. A non-refundable application fee of CDN 100.00 will be required to complete your application.

3» Paperwork

Upload all required documents and transcripts.

4» Acceptance


If you are successful, you will receive a conditional acceptance letter. This process normally takes one week.

5» Commitment

Make your full commitment fee payment and courier your official transcripts to International Admissions.


You will receive a final acceptance letter that you can use to apply for a student visa or study permit.

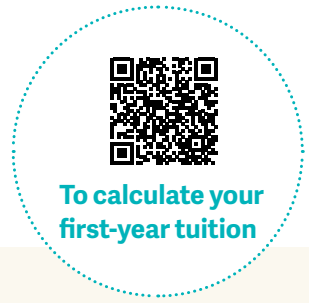
