After the first three days, you will typically start your days with either Language Studies or your elective choice with a short mid-morning break. After your lunch break, you will either have Language Studies or participate in one of the many fun activities before finishing your day. For two days each week, you will attend additional classes to prepare you for the fall semester: Enhanced Language Studies on Tuesdays and Study Skills on Thursdays.
