

## Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council (SSHRC): Partnership Grants (PG)

**Funding:** *Up to \$2.5 million for long-term from four to seven years.*

PG provides support for new and existing formal partnerships to advance research, research training and/or knowledge mobilization in the social sciences and humanities through mutual co-operation and sharing of intellectual leadership, as well as through resources as evidenced by [cash and/or in-kind contributions](#). PG proposal can fit within the objectives of the Insight Program [http://www.sshrc-crsh.gc.ca/funding-financement/umbrella\\_programs-programme\\_cadre/insight-savoir-eng.aspx](http://www.sshrc-crsh.gc.ca/funding-financement/umbrella_programs-programme_cadre/insight-savoir-eng.aspx) and/or Connections program [http://www.sshrc-crsh.gc.ca/funding-financement/umbrella\\_programs-programme\\_cadre/connection-connexion-eng.aspx](http://www.sshrc-crsh.gc.ca/funding-financement/umbrella_programs-programme_cadre/connection-connexion-eng.aspx) umbrella or a combination thereof.

**Application process:** PG is a two stage application process, involving Letter of Intent (Stage 1) and a formal application by invitation (Stage 2). Successful applicants from Stage 1 will be offered a grant worth up to \$20,000 to help prepare formal application for Stage 2.

#### Difference between Partnership Development Grants (PDG) and PG:

- Both provide support for new and/or existing formal partnerships.
- PDGs are awarded to individuals, to design and test new partnership approaches for research and/or related activities. One-stage application process.
- PGs are awarded to institutions, to support initiatives that advance research and/or knowledge mobilization activities. A two-stage application process: Stage 1—Letter of Intent; and Stage 2—Formal Application. Only those proposals awarded a Letter of Intent grant (valued at \$20,000) will be eligible to submit a Formal Application.
