Course descriptions

ENGLISH FOR HEALTH CARE PART ONE: This course will serve as a foundation for the two English for Healthcare courses that follow. Learn to identify and name hospital departments, branches of medicine, common symptoms and basic anatomical and physiological features. Develop strategies for "decoding" terms by examining roots, prefixes and suffixes.

INTERCULTURAL COMMUNICATION SKILLS:

Understanding culture and how it impacts our interactions is critical in today's globalized world. You will explore basic culture theory, verbal and non-verbal communication, cultural gaffes and much more. Equipped with new practical skills, you will be able to navigate through cultural complexities with ease and confidence.

ENGLISH FOR HEALTH CARE PART TWO: Building on the foundation established in Part One, we will shift to more complex anatomy and physiology using body systems as a framework. Units of measure will be reviewed. You will survey a range of authentic documents and recordings to gain familiarity with terminology used in context.

INTERPERSONAL COMMUNICATION SKILLS: Whether dealing with a sudden, life-threatening event or taking the time to put a surgical patient's fears at ease, it is not enough to simply know medical terminology.
