Reports directly to the Provost Vice President Academic & Research Christine Bovis-Cnossen. We are broad-based and work with all TRU academic faculties specifically on Indigenization. We assist with Indigenizing curriculum, research projects and incorporating Indigenous content and Indigenizing the curriculum. We deliver programs on-campus and work in partnership with Indigenous communities to deliver programs under the Ministry of Advanced Education Skills & Training Aboriginal Skills Partnership (ASP) program. We connect TRU with Indigenous (First Nations/Metis/Inuit) communities and provide guidance on protocols, and referrals for elders & knowledge keepers. We work closely with all Indigenous TRU staff and faculty across campus to provide support campus-wide.
